Amsterdam, Thursday 24 November 2022

Visions, dreams, phantasies, and prophecies are intriguing expressions of inner experiences and reflections. When revealed by texts or images, they are often regarded by individuals and groups as harbingers of future events and as admonitions to adjust one's own behaviour. This field of signaling, guidance, warning, promises and possibilities forms the theme of the present symposium. While visions treat or deal with futurity, they remain constructions of the present. Hence, they mirror the culture of that moment in which people are longing for what lies ahead: from ambitions and ideals, to love, eating, traveling and so on. And in relation to this mind set of this future imaginary the everyday is reciprocally influenced by the words and worlds that visionaries, prophets, artists, and all of us, imagine and create. The aim of this symposium is to shed light on this interplay between expectations for the future and daily actions in a versatile and innovative way.

Academia represents a world of (big) data, research and interpretation. However, the symposium lecturers will not discuss futurology in generalized manner but will approach the topic from the perspective of ethnology and cultural sciences, and provide analysis of specific human practices. The international line up of scholars have been encouraged at the same time to be 'out of the box' and visionary in their own way, contributing with new research approaches that will advance our interdisciplinary understanding of visionary experiences and expressive forms.
